Liverpool distribution center employees drive trailer in Lights On caravan

LIVERPOOL, N.Y. – On Saturday, Dec. 5, Dot Foods employees joined the 26th annual Lights On caravan to spread awareness of the dangers of driving while intoxicated or under the influence of drugs.

The Lights On caravan started at 11:30 a.m. and drove roughly 50 miles throughout Onondaga County until 3 p.m. About 100 participants drove 45 vehicles in the caravan, which honors and remembers victims of drunk driving and drug-related crashes.

“Since our drivers are on the road the majority of the year, we feel it’s important to show our support for the drunk-driving cause and to remind people of the dangers of intoxicated driving,” said Hall. “Driving our ‘No-Zone’ trailer also allowed us to highlight safety precautions when traveling near any of our tractors and trailers.”
